


Romance in rural Ireland

Ye been fortunate to interview some well known people over my years in the news business, including the most dignified woman leader I've ever met while sitting at opposite ends of a hotel bed.





Broken dentures

found this older gentleman's dentures on the Centenoka Parking lot last week. However, pieces were broken off and it was fractured. When I posted this on Facebook, it was generally agreed the damage was too severe to fix, except for one denturist who offered to attempt to repair it at no charge. Unfortunately I did not obtain the senior's name:

Here is the post by Laura Deanne:

"Regarding the post about the broken denture: I am a Denturist in town. It **MAY** be possible to fix this, at least reasonably well to be worn. I'm not sure what's been done so far, however, if it's not too late, please do not glue a denture, ever. It negates the ability to have it properly fixed when the glue fails in a few days (the human bite force is 400 lbs/ sq." on average). When the fractured edges are clean, we can set them back together, and secure with beeswax from the outside. Once the pieces are together, a stone model can be made, as a replica of how the denture fits together. With that done, each piece has some of the original acrylic

ground down, to make space for new acrylic. The pieces are placed back on the model, and new acrylic is added to the fractured areas. Once cured, it is trimmed and blended in, then polished. A dentist will only send the denture away to a dental lab, and charge a fortune to do so (Dentist has to pay the lab, plus take a cut).

Denturists are denture specialists. It's all we do. We see our own patients and do the lab work ourselves. So it is, incredibly, actually less costly to see a specialist ...and the result will be inevitably better.

I hope this helps. I may be too late, but I would be willing to attempt to fix the denture for this gentleman for no cost.

TAPPEN HIGHWAY PROJECT

he Trans Canada Highway's Ford Road to Tappen Valley Road Four-Laning project will upgrade approximately 4.3 km and replace the Tappen Overhead bridge. The western limit of the project begins at Ford Road and extends through to its terminus 400 metres east of Tappen Valley Road.

Improvements include:

■ 4.3 km section of the Trans-Canada widened from two to four lanes

■ New east bound commercial carrier pullout

New frontage road system to provide safer access to the highway

Modified protected T-intersection at Tappen Valley Road

Replacement of existing Tappen bridge

■ Improve safety, capacity and movement of goods and services


Provide safer access to local roads for residents, commercial vehicles, tourists and travellers


