





Expanded beach & rooftop camping

> You can not see the distant mountains when this photo was shot by the City of Samon Arm but you see the expanse of extended sandy beach now west of the Canoe Beach boat launch. This part of the shore was formerly occupied by leased cabins.



What is needed for healthy fodder

ue to the past several seasons of dry weather, grass pastures haven't been able to produce well for grazing or hay this summer.

The fertilizing with phosphate and potash I did last Fall, followed by nitrogen this Spring, only produced 40 per cent of normal hay production of recent years.

Second cuts are non-existent without irrigation that only the larger commercial producers have access to.

Hay is already coming into the Southern Okanagan from the US. I have seen very green good alfalfa hay on large semi-trucks in Salmon Arm heading north and west. This is a sure sign of fodder shortage in the dairy and beef industries.

I will not have hay to market this year as in the past. There are other small producers in the same boat.

Fodder availability greatly depends on the number of grass cuts that the big hay and silage producers - selling on the open market - can squeeze out of their irrigated land before the eventual Fall weather arrives in October. Round Bale silage that is often more nutritious than hay will be in high demand.

Availability and demand are essential for the dairy and beef industries, not forgetting horses and for all farm livestock.

Shortages can create firmer prices, but farming, unlike most other industries, is often slow to take advantage of raising prices. It is the nature of long term rural life and well being, past hardships and a sound future with consistent markets. Plenty of snow and a wet Spring are high on the bucket list for 2024. Warm sunshine, rainwater and good soil are the elements for fodder production. If just one of these is eliminated, there will be little.

members played at the Fall
Fair in Armstrong, travelling
by democrat buggies, switching horses in Enderby.

Agnes McGuire donated four acres to the west of the wharf for a playing field. The club members cleared and levelled the grounds. The north end was developed into tennis courts. A pavilion was made out of a shed donated by Mrs. McGuire.

In 1914 the club was disbanded with news of the Great War. It reconvened in the 1920s with the help of the Doe family.

The 1936 members consisted of Guy Elphinston, Art Smith, Don Campbell, Vic Nancollas, J. Nancollas, R. Harvey, Alex Cragg, Constable Hodgkin, Max Ladner, N.H. Bowden, M. Pottie, T. Prescott, Jack Milling, Major F. Bivar, N.C. Dawson. ■
