The ongoing excavation of Kault Hill is a win-win for the four laning project that is now underway from Ford Rd. to Tappen Valley Rd.


The Kault Hill rock is considered an ideal material to construct road embankment through poor ground conditions along most of the project length. According to the project description, the rock removed at nearby Kault Hill will also facilitate future highway widening in that area when that phase is ready.

"Further, by reducing the rock slope in this area, it will save disruption currently experienced from sesonal rockfall and cleanup through this steep section." Ford to Tappen Valley Roads,

Kault Hill is located 3 kms from the project. ■

Funds dispersed for recovery of North Shuswap businesses

huswap Economic Recovery Taskforce (SERT) is has launched a wildfire recovery program aimed at assisting businesses affected by the recent Bush Creek East wildfire in the North Shuswap.

SERT is looking to distribute \$50,000 in funding to businesses that experienced wildfire-related loss this summer.

Funding will be granted to businesses, sole proprietors, partnerships, franchises, non-profit organizations and First Nations businesses and members whose livelihood is based on cultural practice, and was received from donors who specified that their donations go toward assisting North Shuswap businesses.

The grant is part of the initial phase of SERT's larger wildfire recovery program for all impact-

ed communities. It is dedicated to helping North Shuswap businesses rebuild and regain economic footing. Affected businesses are encouraged to apply for funding by completing a Needs Assessment Form that outlines the extent of their losses and their specific needs for recovery assistance.

"The North Shuswap business community is strong, resilient, and closely connected," says John Reed, Co-Chair of SERT and the Executive Director of the Shuswap Economic Development Society. "We understand the challenges businesses are facing, and the SERT team is dedicated to providing as much support as possible to help them resume operations and rebuild a thriving local economy."

SERT will carefully review

applications and allot funding based on a specific set of criteria. For those who do not receive funding from this grant, SERT will be offering other opportunities for wildfire-impacted businesses to access support, including 1 on 1 sessions with Business Recovery Advisors, through Community Futures Shuswap and the Disaster Recovery Economic Adjustment Initiative (DREAI).






